The reunion was held on two consecutive days and many that came on Saturday returned for a second day of fun on Sunday.

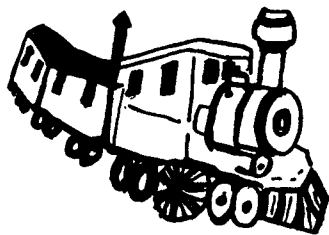
This was the first time some of the older classes had been involved in a reunion, which added to the overall excitement. Hugs, kisses and tears of happiness were seen throughout the crowd.

FRASER EDUCATION FOUNDATION

In December, 1987, the F.E.F. was formally incorporated under the laws of the State of Michigan as a non profit Foundation, totally independent from school administration and school board.

The foundation is governed by a volunteer Board of Trustees. These Trustees are responsible for selected projects attracting and dispensing funds to benefit students of the Fraser School system, helping put the Fraser Public Schools on the cutting edge of education excellence.

Reduced Federal and State funding has created uncertainty in our public school financing. Support is needed by individuals, business organizations and grants from other foundations. The Foundation gives only to areas of education not normally covered by the school budget process.

Contributions can be given for specific project consistent with the goals of the Foundation. Tax deductible contributions can be outright gifts, pledges, monthly or annually, memorials to loved ones, cash securities, real and personal property, deferred gifts through wills, trusts, insurance programs and other instruments.

To date, we have approved mini grants totaling \$5245 from the \$10,000 which was collected through a Charter Campaign and memorial contributions.

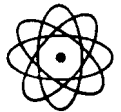
