

I have just been hit with 50 years of history, Not a full 50 years, but just prior to that - 1949 to be exact.

I was surprised to receive a copy of your Alumni Club Newsletter. My cousin, Harvey Sauder, sent me his copy. I had no idea the organization existed. I have often wondered what happened to the people I graduated with.

Let me give you a brief run-down on myself. I was a 1940 graduate. After graduation, I worked at the Chrysler Tank Arsenal. Right after Pearl Harbor, I enlisted in the then Army Air Corp. Did all the usual basic training stuff and ended up at McDill Field in Tampa, Florida. Just before the Bomb Grp., I left for overseas. I applied for and was accepted as an Aviation Cadet. I did all of my training as a pilot in Texas. Falling in love with the State, I finally settled here. During the war, I spent my service time in Europe with a Troop Carrier Grp. We flew C47's (commonly called "gooney bird"). Our function was to carry Paratroopers, tow cargo gliders, evacuate wounded and carry whatever else needed moving in a hurry. We kept General Patton supplied with gasoline and other supplies. For my efforts, I was awarded the Air Medal with Oak Leaf Clusters, ETO Ribbon and seven battle stars.

During my last year(s) at FHS, I helped on the first paper that was printed. I played right guard (No. 13) on the first football team the school ever had. My cousin, Ken Sauder, was Quarterback. My graduating class was a big class - 13, ten boys and three girls. When the class of 40 graduated, so did the football team. Our locker room was the school furnace room. As I remember, we didn't win any games either.

Looking over your January issue #4, I see a few names I remember, Helen Stovel Ayers, Grace Williams, Nellie Glatz, Laban Meyers and Bea Opel. My older brother, Reginald Chase, went to school with Fern (Longnecker) Berry and Willard Steffens.

Please pass on my regards to all the FHS Alumni. Gosh -- those were the good-ole-days.

May 16, 1940 was the scene of the First Athletic Banquet for girls and boys. The banquet was held at the High School with the dinner being prepared by the Home Economics Class.

November, 1937 saw the opening of the first library with over 1000 books on the shelves.




