Mr. Souris passed away in December, 1990 from a sudden heart attack. He was the owner of Carbide Technologies of Fraser. His wife, Bernice, is a trustee of the Fraser Educational Foundation and both have been active in business,

many years. Residing in the Fraser School District since 1966, both of their children, Kimberly - Class of 1987 and Nicholas - Class of 1986, are presently helping their mom in the business.

The Fraser Educational Foundation, a non-profit organization, was established in December of 1987 to assist the Fraser Schools by offering financial assistance for projects that would not be normally covered by the school budget process. Since that time, the Foundation has sponsored over \$20,000 worth of mini-grants to teachers and staff for special projects to enhance our children's educational opportunities.

Nicholas Souris has informed the Foundation that he wishes to continue sponsorship of a \$500 mini-grant yearly in the name of his father.

At its annual August meeting, the Fraser Educational Foundation honored the passing of Theodore Souris (well known in the Fraser business community) by awarding a \$500 mini-grant in his name to Milo Perrault, Fraser High

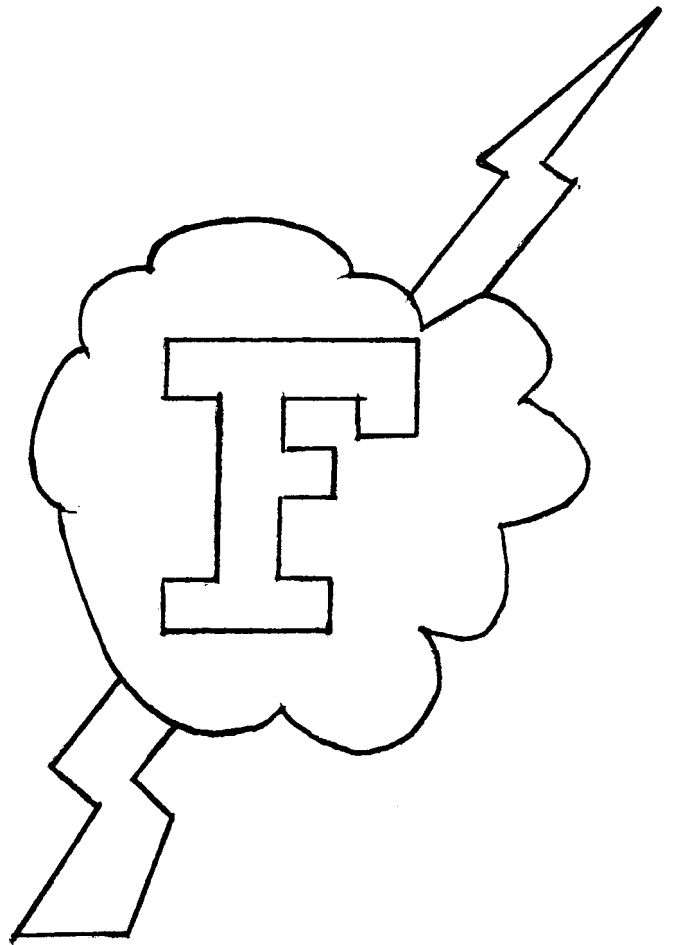

THE ORIGIN OF A LOGO

In about 1947 or 1948, my father decided to donate some warm-up jackets for use by the Frase High School football team. It has been rumored - totally unfounded - that this bequest was prompted by the amount of time his son spent sitting on the bench on cold fall days. At any rate, the company that was to produce the warm-up jackets asked for a copy of the school logo to imprint on the back of the jackets. I relayed the message to our coach, Kenneth Sauder and, in a matter of minutes, he drew up the logo reproduced on this page. I don't know how long this symbol was used by Fraser High School, but I do know some of the warm-up jackets were still in use when my son was a freshman at Fraser High School in 1970.

As a young lad, I used to pump gas at the Fraser Gas & Service Station. The service station was part of a large building that had one or two apartments on the 2nd floor. Cass Shaft, wife and child, lived in one of them and I had the honor of having dinner with them on one or more occasions-Cass Shaft was very instrumental in planting the desire in me to want to go to college. I was glad to know that he was still around (as well as Mr. Miller).

As for the building with the peaked dome, I believe it used to house a Kroger store for a while and I worked in it. Next to this building on Utica was what we kids called the Candy Store, selling candy and ice cream. I worked in this

store as a soda jerk for a summer. My longest work stint was in the Schott's Store next to the bank. I used to clerk there after school and on Saturdays.

So much for the past. Here are a few autobiographical lines for those who are interested...

In 1948 I married my college sweetheart, Ilene, who also graduated from the U of M in 1949 as a social worker.
