


ATTENTION CLASS OF 1958

Favorites were WIMPY'S, the TICK TOCK near the Gratiot Drive-in Theatre, the MALIBU Drive-in on Van Dyke and 15 Mile Road, A&W for a foot long hot dog, WHAT-A-BURGER, and BIG BOY on 14 & Gratiot when it was still a drive-in?

...JOHN ULENBURG was one of those students who moved to the new four room brick school on College Avenue which was built in 1924 and he graduated in 1933. The wooden school was destroyed by fire. IRWIN REINDEL was the Valedictorian of the Class of 1933 after coming to FHS from St. John's Elementary School as many students still do. John remembers Irwin's father, **CHARLES** REINDEL, the founder of Reindel's Hardware, as being one of the most helpful men to all citizens of the small Village of Fraser. John also recalls six inches of snow piled to the top of fence posts. The snow was so high, his father had to take him to school by horse. When there was no snow, he usually walked to school along the railroad tracks from 14 Mile and Groesbeck.



Class of 1943 Celebrates 50th



Remembrances of our class of 1943 . . . The War years . . .

The 18 year old draft was in effect for World War II. Would you be called to serve for your Country? That was what was on every young man's mind at Fraser High School. Many volunteered and some were drafted before they even had a chance to graduate.

Saturday dances were a big event in Fraser. Every weekend the Star Ballroom (now the Vintage House) was the scene of teens dancing to the music of a five-piece band. In summer the dancers moved out to the patio under the stars. Friday nights, whoever had a car (of course 50 years ago cars were very scarce) many teens were seen at the "greasy spoon" restaurant (possibly the Airport Grill) on Gratiot Avenue across from Hartung Airport, which is now Eastgate Shopping Center.

On occasion, we would walk to the Warren Barn at Chicago Road, east of Mound (now the K of C Hall) and dance to our hearts content doing the Old Barn Dances and Square Dances in their upstairs loft. We may have even gotten a ride home, if we were lucky.

Pete Ringler worked at VanMarckes farm on Masonic, now Queen of All Saints Catholic Church. He also worked at Sheppards Gas Station at Utica Road and Groesbeck.

On skip day in 1943 the seniors all piled into several cars and headed for Canada. They arrived at CKLW radio station and were interviewed by Ralph Bing, the disc jockey. They were asked many questions such as "Who was Valedictorian and Salutatorian, what school they came from, etc." This was a big thing to get to talk on the radio (as you remember, no TV.)

Gas rationing was also a thing of the 40s . . . The Junior-Senior Prom was held at the Star Ballroom. There was no yearbook published due to the war.

Baccalaureate Service was held on May 30 at Zion Church. Graduation took place at the Star Ballroom. Class Flower - yellow rose Colors - blue and gold

Motto - "Onward and upward, our goal is success."

These were remembrances of Pete and Dorothy Stifter Ringler.






