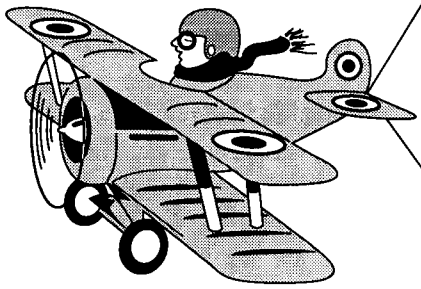

Fraser Grad & Teacher is inducted into the Michigan High School Hall of Fame



Lee O'Bryan, a 1966 graduate from Fraser High School will be inducted into the Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association Hall of Fame in February, 1995, as part of the Associations annual two-day clinic. After coaching tennis for 22 years at FHS, Coach O'Bryan has also been honored as Regional Coach of the Year five times and Macomb County Coach of the Year twice.

In addition, Coach O'Bryan and his girls teams have captured nine league titles, two Regional Championships and three second place finishes to qualify for the state finals. O'Bryan has also coached two first place singles players who were named to the All-State team.

While coaching the boys for three years, O'Bryan's teams went to the state finals twice winning one regional title and placing second during another season. He also took one singles player to the finals as a Regional champion.

Mr. O'Bryan has coached the varsity girls since 1973 and the varsity boys during 1977. 1984-1985. His combined dual meet record is 208 wins and 65 losses for a 76% success rate.

Coach O'Bryan has played tennis for 36 years.

While attending FHS, Lee was the captain of the tennis team in 1966 and a singles player all four years and went to state during his senior year. Coach O'Bryan also played at Central Michigan University for three years, playing #1 on the freshman squad and #5 and #6 on the varsity squad.

Currently he plays on two USTA teams at the Peachtree Racquet Club; Mens 4.0 and 8.0 mixed doubles.

Along with coaching high school tennis, O'Bryan directs a summer camp for players in Macomb County. He began this camp 11 years ago, teaching five days a week for five weeks and hosting a county-wide tournament the sixth week. O'Bryan also continues to instruct younger children through the recreation department as well as providing adult instructions.

Lee has taught at Fraser High School since 1970. The Alumni Club salute you, Lee O'Bryan, on your achievements.

She was known in high school as Elsie "the chubby cheeker" Larson. He was Rich "the legend" Rikken.

She was the homecoming queen. He was a football star.

In 1961 students at Fraser High School voted them the "most popular couple."

It was a love story.

They danced cheek to cheek at a 1991 class reunion and most former classmates figured they'd been together all those years.

Not really.

It was their first dance in 30 years.

Elsie Goetzinger (maiden name Larson), who is the second oldest daughter of Carl and Ethel Larson of Fraser, first met Rich in 1949, at Fraser Elementary School. At that time Elsie and Rich, the son of Joseph and Lorraine Rikken, were more interested in what they were having for lunch than who they were sitting with.

It was just a casual relationship which existed only during school hours or at special functions.

Then in junior high school Rich noticed Elsie.

"I think it was the pretty white uniform that first caught my eye," said Rich who used to show up at Webb Drug and Ben Franklin where Elsie worked as a cashier.

Elsie said her first attraction was the eyes. "They drove me crazy," she said.

Eventually, after going into the store a hundred times and never buying anything, Rich asked Elsie to a school dance and the two became an item.

"It was wonderful. He was so much fun to be with, and I was so happy to be with him," said Elsie recalling the night.

"I was heartbroken and mad so I broke up with her," said Rich.

Elsie eventually married the boy she met that summer. They divorced after 25 years.

Rich was married twice, with each marriage lasting 14 years.

But Elsie and Rich showed up alone at the reunion.

"I had been divorced for three years, and I was very nervous about going to this dance, especially since I knew Rich would be there alone. My girl friends had saved me a seat so I didn't feel as scared. Then he asked me to dance. My feelings were so strong I was afraid to be with him. I wasn't sure if I wanted to get involved," said Elsie.

Then the two talked — catching up on things that had happened since they broke up.

They had never forgotten each other and had always wondered what happened?

This Saturday all will be forgotten in a ring ceremony being held at the Mount Clemens VFW Post 1794 on North Gratiot.

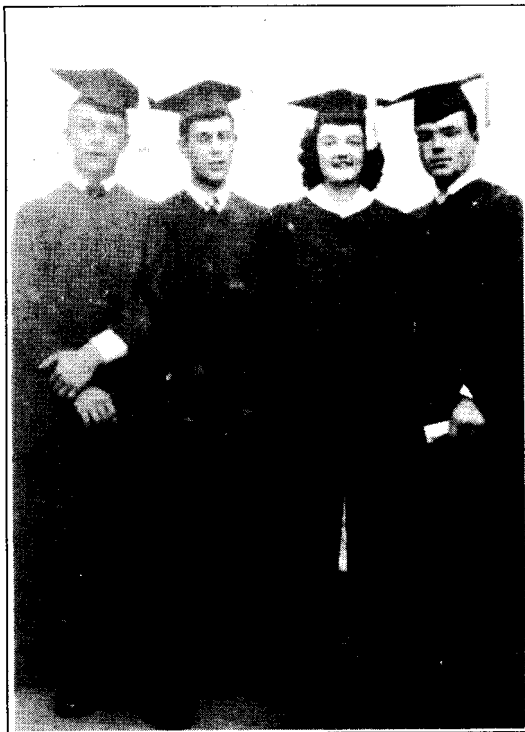
"I'm finally going to marry my high school sweetheart," says Elsie.

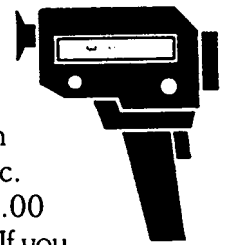

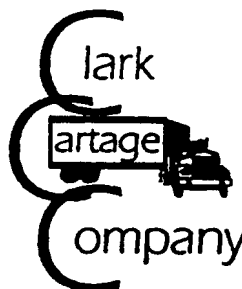

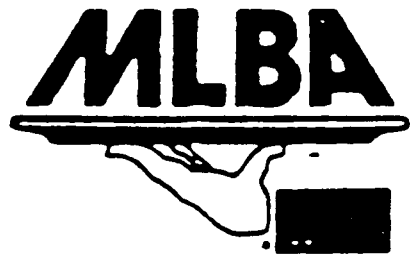
