Our Picnic Band Members

For those of you who enjoy our music entertainment at the annual FHS Alumni Club picnics, we would like to present an overview of some of the alumni band members and how their musical interests got started.



Wayne Baraks '69 started his love of the guitar when he decided to take his guitar to Mrs. Hatch's 4th grade class and played "Walk, Don't Run." He continued playing

with classmates in different bands and performed for school dances that were held in the gym and lunchroom. He gave guitar lessons, played clubs, 'Chatterbox' and the 'Roostertail'; played USO Tours, and was the lead singer for 'Rare Earth' from '87-'94.

Joe Tackett '72, after his MCCC Associates Degree, toured with a 50s nostalgia show band called 'Rock's Gang' for six years, as their original lead guitarist. Performing at Cobo's Autorama Car Shows; state fairs; major nightclubs around the U.S. and Canada. His 80s new wave band 'Savoir Faire' was offered a deal with Geffeb Records.

Dan Richmond '69 found his interest in music by playing the saxophone and piano in grade school. During high school, he jammed with his buddies. His first love was the 'BLUES' and often ends up singing with Detroit's finest Blues musicians.

Bill Hallendy '69 started his music career in the family's pink garage on Groesbeck (M-97). His "Penny Whistle" and later "Motley Crew" bands consisted of his FHS buddies. He currently performs in the Port Huron-Detroit area at lounges, festivals, private gatherings and golf courses while writing and recording his third CD of original music, which sells worldwide from <http://cdbaby.com>.

Randy Holcomb '71 started playing guitar in the fifth grade. His friend, Dave Tilney '69, taught him a lot of what he knows today. In his earlier years, he jammed with classmates Joe Tackett, Mark Davidson, and Rick Hallendy. Later, he and Mike Moats performed with 'Good Humore' cutting a record, did some radio and TV time, and opened for bands 'Fridget Pink' and 'Canned Heat'. He has played drums, guitar, and had been a lead singer with a group from Eastpointe.

He did win 7 Track medals (anchor man for the relays) and received letters for both Football and Track.</p> <p>Before leaving for the Army in April of 1943, he was offered a scholarship for track. He became a Rocket Launcher in Company A of the Combat Engineer Battalion of the 19th Corp of the 1st Army. On his journey through 5 major battles, landing on Omaha Beach, Ted met up with another classmate - Chuck Collins. In 1944 and 1945, he participated in the Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes and Central Europe campaigns. The United States presented prestigious awards for his achievements: the Bronze Star, the Good Conduct Metal, the European, African, Middle Eastern Theater Metal with five Bronze Starts and WWII Victory Medal and the Distinguished Unit Badge.</p> <p>In 2010, he finally received acknowledgments for his valorous actions during World War II. He was metaled and named Chevalier or</p>	<p>Knight of the Legion of Honor, the highest honor that France can bestow. (The Legion of Honor was created by Napoleon in 1802, to acknowledge services rendered to France by persons of great merit.)</p> <p>He is now back home living in St. Clair County and can be seen on thetimesherald.com website.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">All Students to have iPads</p> <p>By TOM WATTS 2012 <small>For Journal Register Newspapers</small> Cathy Amicucci, a 6th sixth-grade teacher at Salk Elementary School in Fraser, listened and learned a different language recently as Apple technology was introduced for the first time in the school district.</p> <p>“Its extremely important,” said Amicucci, who was among the teachers and administrators who attended a workshop to learn more about Fraser Public Schools partnering with Apple on instructional devices. “We’ve had a few iPads we’ve had to share, but very thrilled we all have our own,” Amicucci said. “I can now reach all students. Whether they are middle-of-the-road students or students who are struggling, I can now help them all. Its really great to have this. Its unlimited what we can do with the visual and audio aspects of teaching on (Apples).”</p> <p>Staff from six elementary schools in Fraser,</p>	<p>as well as the middle school and high school, have started phase one of learning about the new Apple technology. The integration of new technology is part of the districts technology bond. The Board of Education approved the school districts first phase of instructional technology purchases.</p> <p>School officials said the first phase was funded by the districts technology bond, which passed in February 2011. The goal is to provide teachers with the new technology.</p> <p>Chris Young of Fraser Schools said the school district will provide students from kindergarten to eighth grade with computer devices in the fall. Meanwhile, students in grades 9-12 will be provided with the devices next year.</p> <p>“Apple has provided additional values for Fraser Public Schools,” Young said, “including professional development for teachers and administrators to kick-start their training on their new devices, and an additional two days per month of training next year.”</p> <p>Gerry Gauthier, president of the Fraser Board of Education, noted in a press release that he was “excited” about the prospects of Apple and Fraser Public Schools coming together.</p>

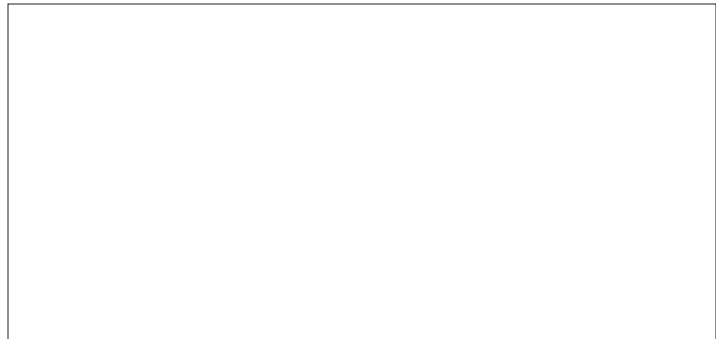
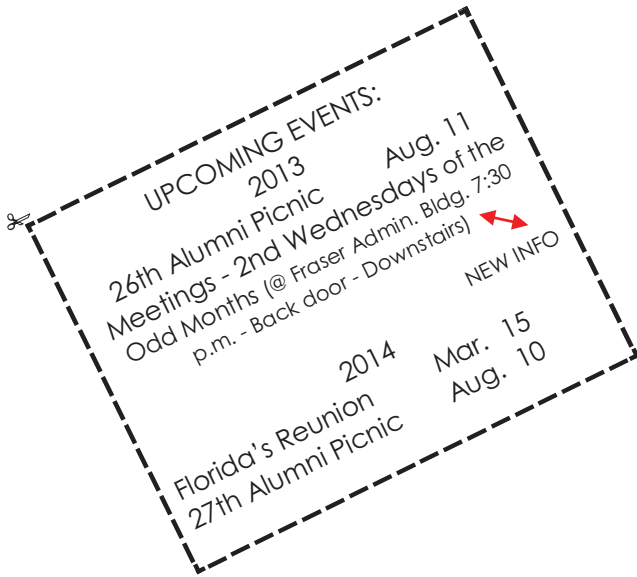
